Source - Please read these instructions fully before assembling or operating and retain for future reference

Power source

- For household and indoor use only
- Keep the appliance and its cord out of reach of children less than 8 years.
- Do not allow children to use the appliance without supervision.
- This appliance can be used by children aged from 8 years and above and persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance in a safe way and understand the hazards involved. Children shall not play with the appliance. Cleaning and user maintenance shall not be made by children unless they are aged from 8 years and above and supervised.
- Do not pull on the charge cable to disconnect from mains supply.
- Fully unwind the charge cable before plugging in and ensure the cable is positioned away from areas where it is likely to get damaged or cause a trip hazard.
- The output cord of this mains adaptor cannot be replaced. In the event of damage to the cable, jack plug or adaptor, the entire adaptor unit should be replaced.
- Connections must only be made via the mains adaptor supplied, never connect the appliance directly to the 240v mains supply.
- Never use the adaptor supplied with any other appliance.

- Remove mains adaptor from supply if appliance is unused for a long period of time, and during thunderstorms.
- Switch off and unplug when not in use and remove the battery before emptying, cleaning or servicing the appliance. Servicing of this appliance must only be carried out by a qualified electrician.
- Always ensure the mains adaptor plug is not obstructed and easily accessible.
 Do not use with 'lockable' sockets or permanently wire to mains

Ventilation, heat and moisture

- Keep the appliance, battery, charge cable and mains adaptor plug dry and away from areas where it is likely to get splashed. Avoid using in hot, humid environments.
- CAUTION: The extension tube, floor head and the vacuum cleaner contain electrical connections, do not immerse in water for cleaning or use to suck up liquids.
- The mains adaptor will become warm in use; do not cover or place on or near surfaces that could be affected by heat such as table tops and carpets.

Warning!

- Entrapment hazard Do not place fingers or other objects near the rotating brush of the floor head or into the nozzles when the vacuum cleaner is in use. Always remove the floor head before carrying out cleaning and maintenance.
- Do not run the appliance off the edge carpets and rugs with fringes.

Charging the Vacuum

This vacuum cleaner uses a rechargeable 25.2V Lithium battery. It is recommended to charge the battery fully before first use. It may take up to 4-6 hours to charge fully. The appliance can operate for 20mins in High mode, 40 mins in low mode.

- 1. Place the appliance on a flat surface or insert into the wall bracket.
- 2. Insert the adaptor cord into the DC jack at the end of the cleaner handle and plug the adaptor into the mains supply socket (Fig.1)



 The light indicator shows the status(Fig 2) Charging :Light 1 Flash,light 2 off Half Charged:Light 1 on,light 2 flash Fully Charged: Light 1&2 on, then off in 10 mins Low battery: Light 1 flash,light 2 off

Notes

- The light indicator(light 2) will flash when the battery is running low and needs to be recharged. If the battery is not charged, the vacuum will switch off.
- Only charge or recharge the vacuum indoors.
- Do not recharge the battery when the air temperature is below 5°C or above 40 °C.



You'll be up and running in no time

- Batteries become hot after prolonged use and will become difficult to charge. Allow to cool and wait about an hour between recharges.
- If light indicator(light 2) is flashing after turning the vacuum cleaner on, you should charge the battery.
- When the battery is fully charged, disconnect the power supply.
- If your vacuum cleaner is not used for a long time (more than 2 months), please unplug it from the power supply. In order to ensure the battery life, it is advised to charge the battery fully once every 2 months.
- Only use the maximum power when needed. The life expectancy of the battery will vary depending on the usage of the vacuum cleaner.

Wall mounting (Ref to the Wall mounting & fixings guide on page 18)

Safety

- Before drilling into wall surface, check for hidden cables or pipes.
 - Wear safety goggles and dust mask when drilling.
 - The use of a residual current device (RCD) is recommended when working with power tools.
- Tools Drill fitted with a 6mm masonry drill bit
- required Screwdriver
 - Pencil
 - Ruler
 - Spirit level
- 1. Choose a suitable location for the wall bracket away from areas where it will get wet or knocked and close to a socket. Check that the charge cable will reach the mains socket (180cm distance max) and that there is sufficient space above and below the bracket (approx. 120-125cm below) for the fully assembled vacuum cleaner be inserted. No part of the vacuum cleaner should touch the floor when fitted into the bracket (fig 6).

- 2. Place the bracket in the desired position and using a pencil, mark the position for the two screw holes. Using a ruler, draw a line joining the points marked for the two screws and using a spirit level, check that it is on the same level.
- 3. If fixing to a masonry wall, use a masonry drill bit, drill holes to a depth of 30mm and insert the wall plugs.
- 4. If fixing to ceramic tiles, use a tile and glass drill bit to drill through the tile and then drill holes to a depth of approximately 32 mm using a masonry drill bit. Insert the wall plugs beyond the depth of the tile.
- 5. Hold the bracket into position, align the fixing holes in the bracket with the wall plugs and insert the screws until the bracket is held firmly into position
- 6. Insert the assembled vacuum cleaner into the bracket (fig.7).

Notes:

- If fixing the bracket to timber, follow the directions above, but only drill a small pilot hole for each screw and do not use wall plugs. This fitting is not suitable for mounting onto doors.
- If fixing to hollow plasterboard walls, use a drill bit suitable for wood and use wall anchors suitable for cavity walls. For maximum strength locate into wall studs and cross braces if possible.

Assembly

- 1. Insert the extension tube onto the body of the vacuum as shown (fig. 8) and push to secure, a click will be heard.
- 2. Attach the floorhead, crevice nozzle or combination nozzle to the end of the extension tube (fig. 8). Ensure that the accessory clicks into place.

3. Alternatively do not use the extension tube and fit the crevice nozzle or combination nozzle directly onto the body of the vacuum cleaner (fig. 9). The floor head can be fitted in a similar manner. Take care when inserting and removing attachments to avoid finger entrapment.



4. Press the release button to remove accessories.



A Guide to

Wall Mounting & Fixings



IMPORTANT:

When drilling into walls always check that there are no hidden wires or pipes etc. Make sure that the screws and wall plugs being used are suitable for supporting your unit. Consult a qualified tradesperson if you are unsure.

HINTS:

- 1) General Rule 🗥 Always use a larger screw and wall plug if you are not sure.
- 2) Ensure you use the recommended drill bit to match the wall plug and hole size.
- 3) Ensure you drill the hole horizontally, do not force the drill or enlarge the hole.
- 4) Take extra care when drilling high walls, ceilings and ceramic tiles. Ensure the plug is fitting below the ceramic tile to avoid splitting or cracking.
- 5) Ensure wall plugs are well fitted and are a tight fit in the drilled hole.

Types Of Walls

You can use one of the following types of wall plug if your walls are made of brick, breeze block, concrete, stone, wood or plaster board.

No.1 "Standard" Wall Plug General Wall Materials



from plastic or sometimes wood fiber.

No.2 "General Purpose" Wall Plug Aerated / Breeze Block



Generally aerated blocks should not be used to support heavy loads, use a specialist fitting in this case. For light loads, a General Purpose Plug can be used.



For use with heavier loads such as TV & HiFi Speakers and Satellite Dishes etc.

No.4 "Cavity Fixing" Wall Plug



For use with plaster board partitions or hollow wooden doors.

No.5 "Cavity Fixing - Heavy Duty" Wall Plug



For use when fitting or supporting heavy loads such as shelving, wall cabinets, coat racks.

No.6 "Hammer Fixing" Wall Plug

For use with walls stuck with plaster board. The hammer fixing allows it to be fixed to the wall rather than the plaster board. Always check the fixing is secure to the retaining wall.

Using your vacuum

Let's get started

Getting started

1. Press the power on button to start.

2. After switching the vacuum cleaner on, press the speed regulation button to adjust the speed. The speed will change from High-Low. The runnign time is 20mins for high mode, and 40mins for low mode.

3. To stop the vacuum cleaner. press the power button.

4. Store the vacuum in the wall bracket when not in use.

Nozzle use

The table below is a use guide for the accessories supplied but there is no hard and fast rule when it comes to vacuuming and the use of each accessory. Use whichever attachment seems to accomplish the job quickly and easily without damaging the surface to be cleaned.

Maintenance

1. Disconnect the charger from the vacuum cleaner before carrying out cleaning and maintenance.

 To ensure your vacuum cleaner works at optimum efficiency, keep the ventilation holes and vacuum cleaner surface free from dirt.
 Ensure that the dust container is emptied and the air filters are washed regularly.

4. Ensure all components are refitted correctly before use.

5. Wipe the outside of the vacuum cleaner and accessories with a damp (not wet) cloth and then wipe dry. Do not use detergents, solvents or abrasives as these may scratch or damage the surface.

6. Never immerse the vacuum cleaner, battery or charger in water.

7. The frequency that the filters should be cleaned will depend on appliance usage. For maximum efficiency the pre-motor filter within the dust container should be cleaned every time the dust container is emptied and the exhaust filter at the top every three months.
8. For best results, don't overfill the dust container and empty it after every use.

Emptying the dust container

1. When the dust container reaches the MAX line marked on the dust container (fig 11) or when the suction power is reduced, it is time to empty the dust container.

2. Hold the container assembly over a household bin and push the dust release latch on the side of the dust container. The debris will fall out into the bin. Please note: Do not allow the dust container to overfill. Don't exceed the MAX level marker.

3. Once empty close the lid until it clicks shut.

3. The inside of the dust container may be wiped clean with a damp cloth. Dry with a soft dry cloth before closing the flap. A click will be heard when it is correctly engaged.

Cleaning the filters

- 1. The frequency that the filters should be cleaned will depend on appliance usage. For maximum efficiency ,suggest to shake off debris on pre-motor filter and exhaust filter when emptying the bin container, rinse under water once a month.
- 2. Press the dust container release button located on the side of the main body near the botton of the dust container, then pull the dust container away from the main body, Keeing the container fairly upright (Fig 13). Remove the circular sponge filter by pinchingthe ribbon material at the top of the filter and pulling upwards, then set aside (Fig 14). Pinch either side of of the fitler assemnly and pull upwards wasy from the dust container(Fig 15), you can tap the cyclone assembly gently over the household bin to remove any large amounts of the dust. Rinse the dust container, cyclone assembly parts and circular sponge filter under running water and lever it dry thoroughly(Fig 16).

- 3. Once all the parts are thoroughly dry, reassemble the filter assembly parts following the arrow and the icon for the locked padlock and place it back into the dust container(Fig 18). Don't forget to put the circular sponge filter back in the top of the filter assembly.
- 4. Place the dust container on the main body until it clicks into place (Fig 19).



Note: The filters are not washing machine or dishwasher safe. Do not use a hair dryer to dry the filters. Using a damp or wet filters will reduce the suction and damage the motor.



Looking after your appliance

Cleaning the brush

The frequency that the brush should be cleaned will depend on appliance usage. Always power off and unplug the vacuum cleaner before removing the floorhead. If the floor head brush stops rotating, the brush head needs to be cleaned.

1. Push the button on the front to disconnect the floor head.

2. Press the release button and turn the tab on the side of the brush bar upwards to access the brush. Pull the roller out from the housing.

3. Remove hair or threads from the roller brush. Do not use water.

4. Once clean refit the brush roller and secure into position by rotating the brush head downwards to lock into place
